### Overview



## Disaster Risk Management (DRM) Qualifications and Memberships

Chris' Master of International and Community Development (MICD) included study elements of both natural disasters and Complex Humanitarian Emergencies (CHEs). He also received some competency based DRM-related training when undergoing his Australian Civilian Corps (ACC) orientation, as well as attending short courses such as Sphere. Chris is a current member of the RedR Australia Humanitarian Standby Team and Australia Assists Roster; the Australian Institute of Emergency Services (MAIES); and the Professionals in Humanitarian Assistance & Protection (PHAP). He was earlier a member of the Australian Civilian Corps (ACC) as both a Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) specialist, as well as of their Post Disaster Recovery Team (PDRT).

Chris' work-related DRM experience should be noted within the framework of the Disaster Risk Management Cycle (DRMC) below. He has been involved in all the key three DRMC stages, namely Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), Emergency Response, and Recovery.
