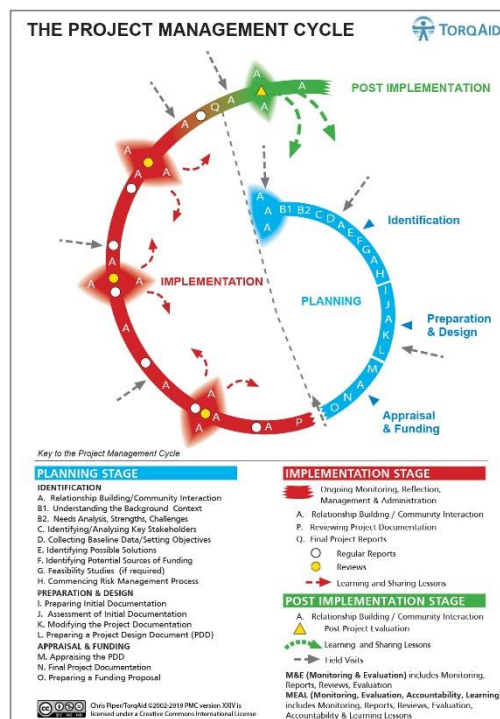
### SC3: The Project Management Cycle (PMC) & Project Design Document (PDD)

- The Project Design Document (PDD)

The PMC is an illustrative framework for analysing the Planning, Implementation and Post-Implementation Stages of a community development or humanitarian project. The PMC focus is very much on relationship building and community interaction, and designed to result in sustainable projects or initiatives.

The PMC Planning Stage includes the development of a Project Design Document (PDD), which in turn is a comprehensive template for covering all the project management issues required in a project tender or submission.
